What is PrayerSteps?

PrayerSteps is an extension of the FootSteps program. It is held at the same time as the FootSteps weekend. Youth and leaders meet for three days of prayer, singing, fun, fellowship, and many surprises. Attendance at PrayerSteps is open to any FootStepper, whether they have ever served on a FootSteps team, as well as FootSteps alumni (those beyond the age limit of the FootSteps program) up to age 21.

PrayerSteps grew out of the initiative of several FootSteppers who could not participate as team members on a weekend because of an overflow of interested team applicants. The primary purpose of PrayerSteps is to provide prayer support for the concurrent FootSteps weekend. The program also includes discussion, worship, and a Christian Seder meal. PrayerSteps meets at Fairview Presbyterian Church (not far from Church of the Cross).

While participants are encouraged to attend the entire PrayerSteps weekend, the beauty of the PrayerSteps program is the ability to be flexible and to allow for participants to leave, if necessary, for work, school, or family events. Parent permission is needed for anyone under 18 to leave the PrayerSteps program. PrayerSteps is a great way for teens who are unable to serve on the FootSteps team to support the FootSteps program. PrayerSteps participants travel together to FootSteps' Holy Hour, the Serenade, and the Closing. They are the only members of the community able to visit with the candidates after the Serenade.

Are there any Team positions for PrayerSteps?

There are no team positions assigned prior to the PrayerSteps weekend. Everyone involved helps with Kitchen, Set up, and Clean up duties. Participants take turns, as they are comfortable, leading activities, reading, and praying. Troubadours are needed to lead singing. (Please let us know if guitar playing is your gift.)

Why should I attend PrayerSteps?

If you are looking for a less structured weekend where you can meet new Christians or renew Christian friendships, discuss concerns of young adult Christians, spend time with God, and grow in your faith – then PrayerSteps is a great place for you!

Ask former PrayerSteppers... they will tell you that PrayerSteps is a lot of fun and that they can't wait to come back.
